The Regular Meeting of the Ridley Township Board of Commissioners was called to order by President Willert at 6:00pm on July 24, 2024 at the Township Building.

Manager's Report

Mr. Ryan requested approval for the following block party requests: 6th Avenue/Stanbridge Road for September 21st; Ridley Circle for September 28th and Braxton Road for October 5th.

Motion made by Mr. McMenamin, seconded by Mr. Saunders to approve the block party requests as presented. Motion carried unanimously (9-0).
